- Students have in-depth guided tour of KCRQ or KSEE Airports which last 120 minutes.
- Tours cover various areas of the airport, such as Fixed Based Operators (FBO), hangars containing many aircraft, flight schools, flying clubs, and maintenance facilities.
- Students have the opportunity to learn about the different roles and functions within the aviation industry and meet professionals such as pilots, mechanics, air traffic controllers, and airport management personnel.
- Students also engage in flight simulator sessions which last 10 minutes per person.
- Qualified HS students receive familiarization flight in GA aircraft which last 20 minutes per person.





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
